## **Hayes Creek Fire**

**Pancake Breakfasts** at the Fire Hall have been feeding around 40-50 people the first Sunday of most months. Upcoming ones are May 6 and June 3. Summer dates have not yet been set – check the 'upcoming events' calendar for dates. Cost is only \$10 – join in for a great breakfast and meet some of your neighbours.

Five medical emergencies, two power lines down, one flooded home (Doug on Lakesyde had his finished basement flooded **again**, Thurs, April 19th). Firefighter and neighbor Dennis set up Hayes Creek Fire pump and fan. Fan was still running as of April 24th. Minor damage to walls and building contents.

Four members have been trained to give Naloxone injections (for Fentanyl and Opioid overdoses). Six members attended a 2 day course on Incident Command and Fire Tactics at Princeton fire hall plus members have attended all day meetings for Emergency Management and Emergency Preparedness in Kelowna and Penticton. Members also attended RDOS Fire Chief's Meetings and RDOS Fire Radio User's group for dispatch improvement.

This in addition to weekly Fire Practice at the hall.

The Hall has been used for weekly Yoga sessions and monthly Aroma therapy sessions, and we welcome use of this space for events that include and benefit the community.

Hayes Creek Fire operations receive no government funds, so please ensure you pay your annual Property Registration Fee of only \$100/property. Hayes Creek Fire responds to all local fire and medical emergencies with trained first responders and equipment.
