Hayes Creek Fire

Pancake Breakfasts at the Fire Hall have been feeding around 40-50 people the first Sunday of most months. Upcoming ones are May 5 and June 2. Cost is only \$10 for adults – join in for a great breakfast and meet some of your neighbours.

During the cold snap, Lee Creek culvert under Meadow Crescent froze up. Again a strange weather year as normally the creek is not flowing during winter. As the culvert was plugged with ice and the creek still flowing, on March 12 water poured over Meadow Crescent, causing a very slippery, icy street with ice on the road in front of 2 or 3 properties. Thru cooperation of RDOS, equipment was brought in to 'thaw' the culvert and eliminate the cause of the problem. Sand was dumped on the road to minimize the impact.

Hayes Creek Fire operations receive no government funds, so please ensure you pay your annual Property Registration Fee of only \$100/property. Hayes Creek Fire responds to all local fire and medical emergencies with trained first responders and equipment.
