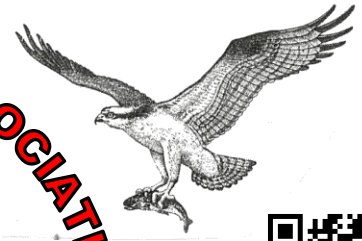

## President's 2018 Christmas Newsletter

After a dry summer, it now looks like winter is well underway. It started snowing and staying mid November – with about 2" this week, we're expecting sleds out on the local trails any day.

For all those travelling on the highways to Vancouver, watch out as many of the speed limits have been reduced – Highway 1 from Aldergrove to Hope is now 100km/h. Highway 3 from Sunday Summit to just east of Princeton is back to 80km/h.

The washout along Princeton-Summerland Rd, about ½ way to Princeton is currently being worked on. Hopefully it will be complete and back to two-way traffic before Christmas. The two culvert enlargements in our area, on Meadow and Lakesyde were on the list but looks like will not be completed this year, except for some large concrete dividers which were recently installed. Let's hope for a mind run-off next spring and no flooding.

Telus have recently added 'spotty' coverage along the Hope-Princeton Highway, with full coverage at Eastgate, Manning Park Lodge, and Sunshine Village. Also, for those near Osprey/Link Lakes with WiFi internet coverage, most carriers and plans now allow WiFi calling - you can answer and make cell calls. To set up on an iPhone, go to Settings/Phone/WiFi Calling.

Long time Lee Creek property owner Abe Unra, passed away in Sept. He sold his property here in 2014 after spending many years in the community.

It always seems so quiet around the lake this time of year but hopefully Christmas will liven things up with many property owners spending extra time enjoying the snow and everything the Osprey Lake area has to offer. ### **Corn Roast 2018:**

After another record year of forest fires and smoke, it cleared up for a sunny warm weekend for our 35th annual community event. Around 450 people took part in our 'end of summer' celebration. Events started on Friday with the fishing derby. The winning fish this year, of just over 1 pound, was caught by Jody Huff, winning her an inflatable boat. Child's award went to Rylie Jensen. There was a record 56 registered and 53 fish weighed in.



Saturday started with 32 players in the Bocce tournament. Winning team was: Skye M, Jake P, Lea V, & Lellan B; runners up: Eva Bailey, Rennie D, Travis Carriere, & Terence T. The Corn Hole tournament followed with 56 players - winning teams were: "A" Eric Mennen & Cody G, runners up: Lea V & Avery M; "B" Trish M & Rob M, runners up: Janet D & Jessie M.

Sunday morning started with Hayes Creek Fire leading 38 children in the bike parade, followed by the kid's races, painting craft, and fishing pond. Free Corn-on-the-cob started around 10:30, with 500 cobs of corn and 300 hot dogs enjoyed throughout the day while the crowd enjoying the music of the local Allenby Blues Band. Five Chili Masters vied for the title of Best Chili – Best taste winner was Jake Petkau, runner up Mike Patricelli, and Best Table Decorations Bruce Graham. After the Horse Races, the big event for many people, young and old, is the very popular cake walk – people competing for one of the 50 cakes donated by local residents. Entertainment continued with the canoe races across the windy, cool lake (along with a few tip overs). Winners were: Mixed couples: Jen & Alexander, runners up: Candice & Chantelle; Men's doubles: Lucas & Travis, runners up: father and son team of Len & Troy M. The day ended with about 330 bingo fans enjoying 10 games under the tarp and out of the sun. The games were split up with fire pit and meat raffles. Winners of the prize draws were - BBQ: Joan Brenton; Bradley Smoker: Taryn Jewell; Outdoor Wooden Table and Chairs: Emily Sheppard; and Kids' Mudslinger ATV: Christy Stevens.

The event could not have happen without the generous prize and food donors and to the many local volunteers who spent many hours and helped so much during the weekend. Profits from the day will be used for community improvements.

The upper east patio deck and east and west side walkway coverings are now complete, thanks to Peter and Rob.

This is the time of year when the lake ice is starting for form, but initially dangerously thin. If an accident should occur, remember, the only safe rescue technique is the boat method, with ropes and life jackets! Always make sure ice thickness is sufficient before venturing out.

Hayes Creek Fire will be hosting a **Craft & Bake Sale** at the Fire Hall on Saturday, December 8<sup>th</sup> from 11:00am to 2:00pm. Time to start your Christmas shopping. Everyone is welcome, and for a small donation, lunch will be served. 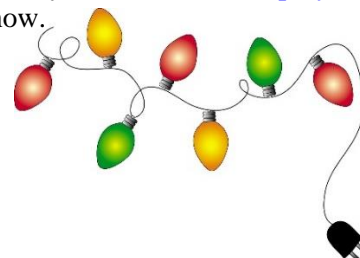
